

Step by Step Make-up

To particularly help our 'new' mums, Harbour Performing Arts Centre have sourced a very affordable and local range of cosmetics and we would like to encourage all children to wear this as a standard performance make-up. The name of the make-up range is 'Satin' and it is available at Soul Pattinson Pharmacy, City Centre or the Amcal Pharmacy, Boambee.

YOU WILL NEED;

Eyeshadow - 'Satin' Duo Spice

Eye liner - 'Satin' Black

Mascara - 'Satin' Black

Blush - 'Satin' Rose

Lipstick - 'Satin' Red Shade no. 4

Lip liner (optional) - 'Satin' Flame

Foundation (optional for juniors) – a brand and colour of your choice

Pressed or loose powder – a brand and colour of your choice

Tissues, cotton buds and wet ones

Helpful hint: HPAC have organised a make-up kit which includes; lipstick, eyeshadow, eyeliner, mascara and blush from Soul Pattinson Pharmacy, City Centre for \$25.00 (ask for Tracey). It's a great way to start.



performance make-up...

1. HAVE EVERYTHING READY IN FRONT OF YOU

2. Sit your child on a chair or stool at a good height directly in front of you with good natural light
3. Foundation – apply a foundation and/or powder, be sure to blend the edges out gently so there is no line. This is optional for the juniors and sometimes a powder may be enough.
4. Eye shadow – using the lighter colour first, apply to the entire lid area, this will open up the eyes and make them appear larger. Then carefully apply the darker colour to the crease and outer corner of the lid.
5. Eyeliner – apply eyeliner to the upper lid starting from the inside corner and working out.
Tip: If you use liquid eye liner, practice making straight lines as it can be very difficult. Eyeliner on the lower lids can make your eyes appear smaller – to open them up, line only the upper lids.
6. Mascara – For extra thick, fuller eyelashes, apply mascara to the top and bottom of your lashes.
Tip: You can hold a tissue on the top lid whilst apply the mascara, this helps stop smudging.
7. Blush – apply blush along cheekbones from hair line downward. Use a soft medium-sized blush brush to avoid a stripping affect.
Tip: Puckering up and sucking in will help find those cheek bones.
8. Lip liner – optional and only recommended for those who are used to applying it.
9. Lipstick – follow the shape of the lips to apply the lipstick.
Tip: Apply pressed powder on and around the lips first if the lipstick has a tendency to “bleed.”
10. Dab lipstick – to avoid the problem of lipstick on the teeth, after application, press the lips gently into a tissue to ensure any excess is removed.



Apply foundation and/or powder

Start from the inside corner when applying eyeliner



Mascara can be applied to the top eyelashes



It may help to hold a tissue to avoid smudges



Use a full soft brush when applying blush




Line lips or just apply lipstick to natural line



Use a wet ones if you need to touch up



Dab lips with a tissue to avoid lipstick on the teeth



The finished result should look great

TIP: If you haven't applied performance make-up before then practice it a couple of times before the big day, your child will think it is so much fun.
